The chosen candidate will work under the direction of the Assistant Agricultural Commissioner/ Sealer of Weights & Measures. Job duties will include the management of County weights and measures programs, including inspection, testing, and enforcement.

The department

The Agricultural Commissioner's Office consists of 43 full-time employees and over 30 seasonal/ part-time employees and has a budget of \$8,572,011 (FY 22-23). The Office enforces the provisions of the California Food and Agricultural Code and the Business and Professions Code to promote and protect agriculture, the environment, the public's health and safety, and an equitable marketplace. Additionally, the Agricultural Commissioner's Office enforces pesticide use, worker safety regulations and quarantine regulations and performs pest detection, pest management and pest eradication activities. San Joaquin County Weights & Measures division performs over 12,800 inspections per year and has achieved an average compliance rate of 93.8%.

The ideal candidate's profile will possess experience in and knowledge of weights and measures programs, enforcement, and testing devices, which demonstrates a sense of initiative and commitment to continual innovation; a strong background in preparing and monitoring budgets in a fee-based environment; and demonstrated ability to maintain communication with state entities and industry stakeholders related to mandated reporting. Additionally, the ideal candidate will demonstrate strong leadership abilities in supervising staff and managing weights and measures programs, possess excellent public speaking skills, and demonstrate strong communication and writing skills to support interagency relations. Possession of a California Class B drivers' license is desirable.

Typical Duties

- Assists in planning, organizing and directing a comprehensive program in inspection, testing, calibration and sealing of commercial weighing and measuring devices.
- Assists in the formulation of weights and measures-related departmental policies and procedures; insures the implementation of policies; recommends procedural changes; prepares policy and procedural instructions and manuals.
- Assigns, supervises, reviews, evaluates and participates in the work of weights and measures staff; supervises the training of subordinate personnel; participates in employee screening and selection.
- Participates in the more difficult assignments such as criminal prosecutions and hearings; serves as resource person for subordinate staff; verifies permissible tolerance of weights and measures testing devices used by the department.
- Assists in preparation and monitoring of the division budget; prepares a variety of reports and correspondence; conducts surveys required by State or other agencies.
- Maintains liaison with other departments and agencies; may represent the department before civic, professional and other organizations; interprets weights and measures program to interested groups and individuals.

Minimum Qualifications

EITHER PATTERN I

Experience: Five years in certificated weights and measures inspection and enforcement work in State of California.

OR PATTERN II

Experience: Three years in certificated inspection and enforcement work within the San Joaquin County Agricultural Commissioner's Office.

<u>AND</u>

License: Possession of valid California driver's license. Class B drivers' license is desirable.

Special Requirements: Possession of a valid registered license as a Deputy County Sealer of Weights and Measures issued by the California Department of Food and Agriculture.
