About the Department

The San Joaquin County Office of the Medical Examiner is a newly created division within the Health Care Services Agency that is now among a select few counties in California that has a Medical Examiner's Officer separate from the Sheriff's Department. The Office is tasked with providing independent, objective and timely medical, investigative, administrative and custodial functions to determine the cause and manner of death through careful examination and significant evidence. The department is committed to excellence, professionalism, and integrity as we serve our community. San Joaquin County values excellence, importance of the individual, team concept, ethical conduct, professionalism, importance of community and a safe and healthy environment. It is anticipate for fiscal year 2020/2021, the department will have an operating budget of \$4.7 million and employ 15 full-time and part-time employees.

Compensation and Benefits

Annual Base Salary: \$99,028—\$120,369

In addition to the base salary, the County offers a Cafeteria Plan in the annual amount of \$24,023 which is considered the employer's benefit contribution and may be used to purchase medical, dental, and vision coverage.

Depending on the health plan selected, premiums not paid by the Cafeteria Plan allowance will be the employee's responsibility through a pre-tax deduction. Unused monies are paid as additional salary.

Minimum Qualifications

REQUIRED

<u>License</u>: Possession of a valid California Driver's License.

Special Requirements: 1) Completion of an approved course of instruction in death investigation, such as California POST Coroner's Death Investigation course or equivalent, is required within one (1) year of appointment. 2) Completion of a POST certified PC 832 course is required within one (1) year of appointment. Failure to meet these requirements may result in a release from employment

DESIRABLE

<u>Education</u>: Possession of a master's degree from an accredited college or university in business administration, public administration, biology, criminal justice, forensic science, or related fields.

Experience: Five years progressively responsible experience in a supervisory, managerial or administrative capacity in a medical examiner/coroner setting; OR five years of public agency fiscal, purchasing, human resources or related management experience.

<u>Certification</u>: Valid certification from American Board of Medicolegal Death Investigation (ABMDI)

Supplemental Questions

In addition to the standard application, responses to the following questions will be required:

- Provide an overview of your professional management or supervisory work experience in a medical examiner/coroner setting.
- Describe your budget experience, including the size and complexity of the budget and your level of participation in the preparation and oversight process.
- * Describe your experience working collaboratively with inter— and intra-agencies.
- Provide an example of a creative and innovative solution or improvement you suggested that is still being used today.

Selection Process

If warranted by the number of candidates, applications will be reviewed by a screening panel. The screening panel will select those most qualified to be considered for continued participation in the selection process.

Final appointment is made by the Chief Medical Examiner.

Offer of employment will be conditional upon successfully passing a pre-employment background and drug screen.

This position is exempt from the San Joaquin County Civil Service system. Appointments to exempt positions are at-will and are not governed by the Civil Service Rules.
