


San Joaquin County Public Health Services Supervising Public Health Educator

THE POSITION



This is the supervisory class in the Public Health Educator series. An incumbent in this class supervises professional and sub-professional staff responsible for assessing public health education needs including developing, implementing and evaluating appropriate programs, services and materials. In addition to assigned supervisory duties, incumbents also perform a wide range of professional health education duties.

SUPERVISING PUBLIC HEALTH EDUCATOR

TYPICAL DUTIES

- Supervises and participates in the development, implementation and maintenance of programs and services designed to meet the public health educational needs of private and public organizations, schools, community groups and the general public.
- Supervises professional and sub-professional public health education staff; selects and/or participates in the selection of new employees; ensures that assigned employees receive appropriate training; assigns and directs staff work activities; monitors and evaluates staff performance; initiates corrective and/or disciplinary actions as needed.
- Coordinates with the Health Education Program
 Coordinator and other agency managers and staff
 regarding the development, implementation and
 evaluation of the health education components
 pertaining to their specific activities; may consult
 with management in the development of various
 agency programs.
- Supervises and participates in the preparation and delivery of presentations to various community and public groups; provides education liaison between Public Health Services and various interest groups, agencies and schools, and assists these organizations in developing internal health education programs.
- Supervises and participates in the development of programs and services to interpret the work and availability of public health services to public groups, other agencies, and the general public and to make the public aware of public health needs, problems, general health maintenance practices and methods of disease prevention and control.
- Coordinates with the Deputy Director and department managers to determine staff development and training needs; serves as liaison to agency and County staff development programs.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Education: Possession of a master's degree in Public Health from an accredited college or university, with a specialization in public or community health education programs, or the equivalent, accredited by the Council on Education for Public Health.

<u>Experience</u>: Two years of post-graduate experience as a public health educator.

License: Possession of a valid California driver's license.



IDEAL CANDIDATE

The ideal candidate will have knowledge of the principles, methods and materials of public health education and general public health principles, programs, organizations, and resources. It is important they possess an understanding of budgeting, finance, contracting, outreach and marketing, and personnel management. Familiarity of the principles and practices of developing, preparing and presenting educational materials in written and exhibit form as well as the ability to prepare technical educational literature and related printed material and communicate effectively, both orally and in writing.
